I thought it would be good to put down some notes on the schedule for the modeling in WP4 that we shaped together in the discussion. Just to keep everybody on the same page.

Phase 1 (next two weeks): Eris will write a summary of the model approach that we discussed. Fred will send some reading suggestions to Marco. Marco will familiarize himself with the literature provided by Eris and Fred. Everybody should receive the description of the model at the end of the period.

Phase 2 (month of October): Marco will begin to work on the model together with Eris and based on the initial work that Eris has done over the last months.

Phase 3 (month of November) Marco will stay in Chemnitz and Münster for four weeks to receive further guidance by Fred on the modeling and discuss with me and Katharina about how to link the modeling with the experimental data. It is hoped that at the end of this period we have a first working model according to the specifications discussed in the last days. This will be a simple model that does the basic task and that could then, in the following months, be made more specific and compliant with the data.

It is understood that all of this is subject to Marco's interest in doing this project. I have used his name for simplicity. If somebody else is to be put in charge of the effort in the next week that is okay and should not affect the schedule.
